This Cookies Policy is provided by the Parochial Church Council of the Parish of St Matthew and St Luke, Chadderton ("the PCC", "we") to explain how we use cookies on <u>https://www.stmatthew-stlukechadderton.org.uk/</u> ("the website", "our website") to enhance the browsing experience and inform the PCC on how visitors use our website. The PCC, which is governed by the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure (1956) as amended, and Church Representative Rules that came into force on second of January 1957, is the elected executive governing body of St Matthew's Church ("the Church") which is situated in the Archdeaconry of Rochdale within the Diocese of Manchester ("the Diocese").

Section 1 – Cookies and tracking technology

The website may use cookies or browser tracking technologies to provide a better overall user experience. This information allows us to continue modifying the site to meet end user browser types, operating systems, and frequency of visits. Aggregate cookie and tracking information may be shared with third parties.

Section 2 – What are cookies and how long do they stay on my device?

A 'cookie' is a text file that's stored on your computer, tablet, or phone when you visit a website. Session cookies are ones that are deleted when you close down your browser whereas persistent cookies remain on your device until they are either expired or deleted. Persistent cookies enable us to remember things about when you return to our website. To find out more about cookies, visit <u>www.allaboutcookies.org</u>. Note that other sources of information are available.

Section 3 – How our website uses cookies

Our website uses GA4 provided by Google Analytics which is a tool that allows the PCC to view the utilisation of our website so that we can continue to offer you positive experiences. GA4 collects website usage data which includes:

- 1. the number of website users;
- 2. session statistics, for example average time a user spends on a page;
- 3. browser and device information;
- 4. page views;
- 5. scrolling behaviour;
- 6. outbound clicks away from our domain;
- 7. site search;
- 8. video engagement;
- 9. file downloads;
- 10. form interactions.

GA4 also collects predefined user dimensions which may include:

- 1. age;
- 2. approximate geolocation;
- 3. gender.
